Forward echelon moved from Monteporzio Catone, Italy to bivouac area Monte Mario, Italy, 4 miles north west of Rome. Bivouaced in grounds of an insane institution. (Manicomio Provinciale)
Weather fair. Usuall Administrative duties.

Rear echelon remained in Sabaudia, Italy.

7 - June:

Advance C. P. Moved from bivouac area north west section of Rome to bivouac area 16 miles north of Rome along highway

Forward echelon remained in bivouac Manicomio Provinciale, Italy.

Rear echelon remained in Sabaudia, Italy. Weather overcast. Usual administrative duties.

8 - June:

Advance C. P. moved from bivouac area 16 miles north west Rome to bivouac area south of R Campolungo, Italy.

Forward echelon remained in bivouac at Manicomio, Provinciale, Italy.

Part of rear echelon moved from Sabaudia, Italy to Manicomio, Provinciale. Weather fair. Administrative duties.

9 - June:

Advance C. P. remained stationary.

Forward echelon remained Manicomio Provinciale.

Rear echelon completed move from Sabaudia, Italy to Manicomio Provinciale. Weather fair. Administrative duties.

10- June:

Advance C. P. remained stationary.

Forward and rear echelons remained in Manicomio Provinciale, Italy. Bivouaced in seperate areas.

The three echelons of Division Headquarters and Headquarters Company with attached units now designated as Forward echelon, rear echelon, and rear echelon Administrative.

Division taken off line 1000. Weather fair. Administrative duties.

11 - June: All echelons remained stationary.

Company Commander made reconnaissance for rest area bivouac

Weather rainy. Routine administrative duties.

12 - June:

Forward echelon remained stationary but sent detail of men from defense platoon to 85th Division rest area south of Rome to hold bivouac area selected for Division Headquarters and Headquarters Company.

Rear echelon remained at Manicomio Provinciale, Italy.

Rear echelon "Administrative" moved from Manicomio Provinciale to Division rest area south of Rome.

Division Unit Personnel sections returned to organizations. Weather Fair. Normal duties.

13 - June: Forward echelon remained in bivouac area south of R. Campolungo.

Rear echelon moved from Manicomio Provinciale to 85th Division Rest area 13 miles south west of Rome at Castel Proziano, Italy. Left Manicomio Provinciale 0845, arrived Castle Parziano 1045.

Rear echelon "Administrative" in rest area.

14 - June: Forward echelon and M. P. Platoon closed in bivouac area at Division rest camp at 1600.

All of Headquarters Company and attached units now operating in one echelon. Bivouac area vicinity Castel Porziano, Italy.

15-29 June: This period spent in rest camp. Time spent in training and recreational activities. Also in replacing and renovating equipment. During this period all of command had opportunity to visit Rome on one day pass and most of them twice. Several five day passes were also granted. Men had opportunity of seeing movies nightly. Several U. S. O. shows were also presented. There were facilities for playing games and the Division Band furnished entertainment. The training program included considerable chemical warefare training. Defense platoon fired all authorized weapons.

On 19 June Company was given booster shot for typhus. On 29 June Company had first General Court Martial trial. Three enlisted men were convicted of AWOL.

30 - June:

Company participated in a Division formation for General Mark W. Clark. General Clark praised Division very highly and presented decorations to several members. He stated that the achievements of the 85th Division would be one of the highlights in the history of the present war.

Band played at ceremony. Distance marched to and from

formation 8 miles.

Company paid. Weather hot.
